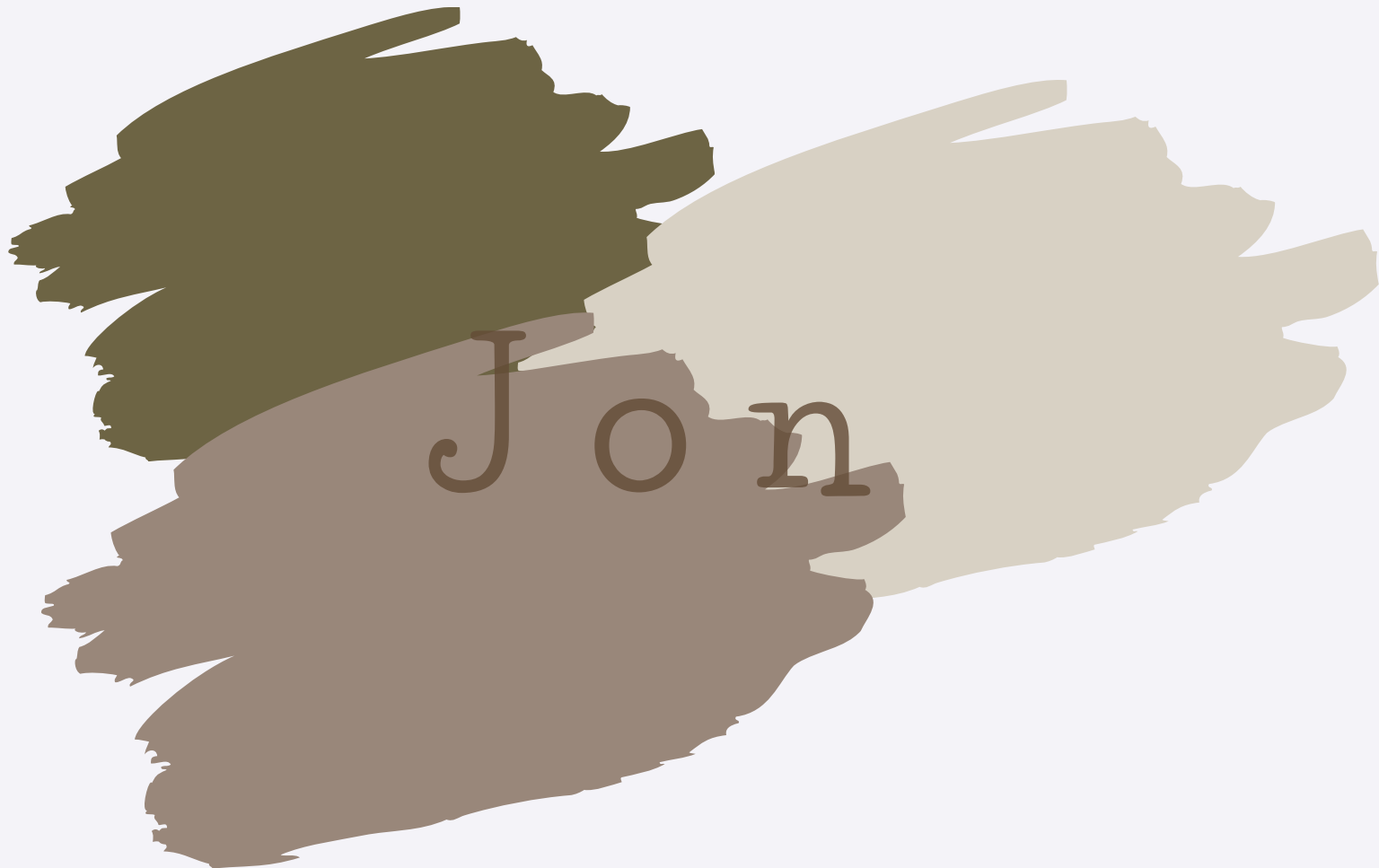

As we entered the 1990's, fashion continued to build off the casual style of the late 1980's but, became very minimalist.

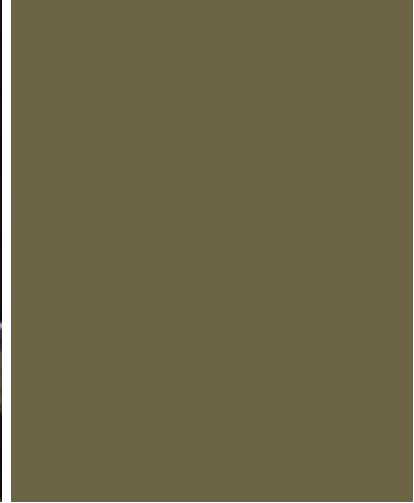
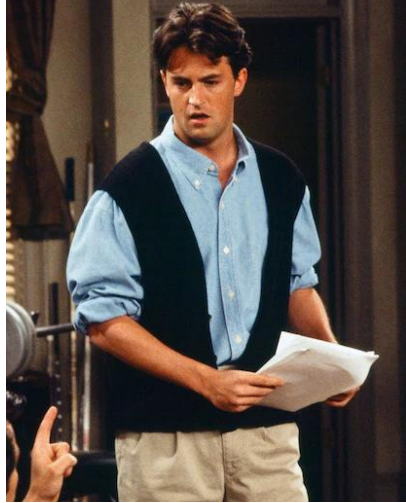
Grunge became popular in Seattle in the late 80's and inspired a movement of second-hand stores to begin to open widespread. 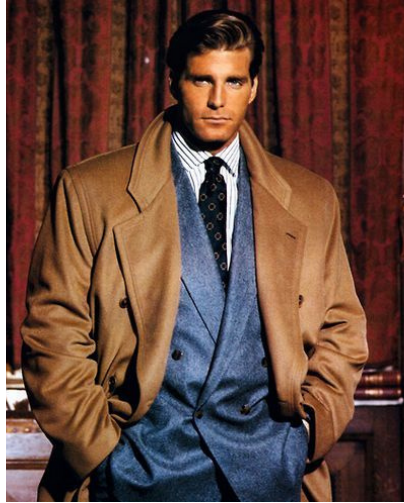

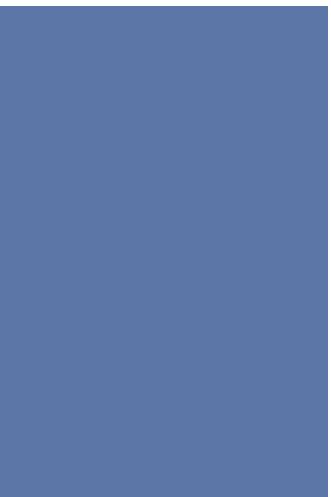
